Dick was a decorated WWII veteran hero and was awarded the silver star and six air medals. Active duty September 1941 to October 1945. He flew a HellDiver Aircraft at Iwo Jima, Guam, Okinawa and Leyte Gulf. later he was a carrier flight instructor back in the Pensacola, FL. He loved this assignment because he could play golf in the afternoons after instructing new pilots.

After WWII Dick attended Harvard Business School and later spent his career as a nation sales manager for Merckens Chocolates and Nabisco.

After Graduating from Harvard Dick married to Barbara (Dell) Harding. They lived a great life in Lexington and enjoyed traveling, playing, golf, bridge and skiing. Dick continued to ski until he was 91 and played his last round of golf at 98. Dick and Del had three children, Richard Harding, Janice Cronstrom and James Arnold Harding 3rd. Today Richard lives in Windham, NH with his wife Debbie, Janice lives in Dunstable with her husband Pete and James lives in Lexington with his wife Andrea and children Kelley and Matt.

Dick will be missed by all including many friends for the Lexington Golf and ski club. As on close friend recently stated, "he was an officer and a humble gentleman and will leave a big hole in a lot of lives".

Services will be held later in June at a private burial on Martha's Vineyard Island. Dick will be buried with his wife, father, Mother and grandparents.
