TOURNAMENT CONDITIONS AND INFORMATION

1. <u>Eligibility</u>: The tournament is open to any amateur golfer affiliated to Women's Golf South Africa, or any amateur golfer affiliated to a governing body recognised by WGSA. **Age restriction**: **Players must be born in 2000 or later**.

2. Handicap Limits & Format & Entry Fee: See Programme of Events

Nomads Trophy - Championship Division (Handicaps 9 & Under): 54 holes Stroke Play

Sunday: 15 July: pm - 1st round

Monday: 16 July: am & pm – 2nd & 3rd rounds Entry Fee: R320 (includes light meal at prize-giving)

Sally Little Trophy - B Division (Handicaps 10 – 18): 36 holes Stroke Play

Monday: 16 July: am & pm – 1st & 2nd rounds **Entry Fee:** R220 (includes light meal at prize-giving)

 C Division (Handicaps 19 – 24): 36 holes Stroke Play Monday: 16 July: am & pm – 1st & 2nd rounds
 Entry Fee: R220 (includes light meal at prize-giving)

D Division (handicaps 25 – 35): 18 holes Stableford

Monday: 16 July: pm - 1st round

Entry Fee: R120 (includes light meal at prize-giving)

- 3. <u>Rules of Golf</u>: The Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Limited will apply together with such local rules approved by the Tournament Committee.
- 4. <u>Tournament Committee</u>: The Tournament Committee will be appointed by the Women's Executive of WP Golf and their names will be displayed on the Tournament Notice Board at the Host Club. This committee reserves the right to alter the programme, regulations and conditions of the event at any time, including starting times. All disputes shall be settled by the Tournament Committee whose decision shall be final. Any dispute/protest should be lodged within 15 minutes of completion of the round. This information may be requested in writing.
- 5. Entries: All entries and payments shall be sumitted ONLINE on the WP web site: www.westernprovincegolf.co.za. The on-line entry incorporates an on-line payment facility which allows for payments via EFT or CREDIT CARD. Entries will not be accepted unless payment is made (using the Payfast system). Kindly follow the instructions given during the entry process. Important: Please use the unique code that is generated by Payfast as your beneficiary reference. No telephonic or emailed entries will be entertained. Should you experince any difficulties kindly contact WP Golf during office hours.
 - All entries shall be subject to the approval of the Women's Executive of WP Golf and no entries will be accepted from players whose handicaps have lapsed. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to limit the field. In the event of the Tournament being oversubscribed, the Tournament Committee reserves the right to reduce numbers in the C & D Division with preference being given to WP Golf affiliated players and then eliminating in handicap order, from the highest handicap. Only WP Golf affiliated players are eligible to win CLOSED events.
- 6. <u>Handicaps:</u> Handicaps as of 07h00 on 15 July 2018 apply and determine the division in which a player competes and will be applied to calculate all nett results. It is the responsibility of each competitor to advise

WP Golf Operations (Lindy Magnussen: lindy@wpgu.co.za / 021 761 4195) of her correct handicap on the first day of play, subject to the following conditions:

- 6.1 Those players who are affiliated to WGSA and who have not been in South Africa for the last 6 months or part thereof, are required to submit their scores on the HNA as a "foreign round" as a verification of the foreign rounds, unless sufficient current rounds have been played in South Africa to validate their South African handicap.
- 6.2 Those players who are not-affiliated to WGSA (i.e. non-SA players) are required to submit a Handicap certification from their Federation or Home Club with their entry and at registration.
- 6.3 Should a player have a handicap change which changes her Division she must ensure she notifies WP Golf Operations (Lindy Magnussen: lindy@wpgu.co.za / 021 761 4195) immediately and be available to play in the scheduled rounds as indicated on the Programme of Events.
- 7. <u>Ties</u>: In the event of a tie in the Championship Division (9 & Under Handicaps) the result shall be decided by a sudden death play-off until a result is achieved. The play-off hole/s will be posted on the Tournament Notice Board. If the playing of a sudden death play-off or continuation of a sudden death play-off is deemed by the Tournament Committee to be impractical, for any reason, then the trophy will be shared. In the event of a tie in the remaining Divisions, the trophy will be shared and prizes will be awarded in accordance with the WP Golf Count-out method. Prize Restrictions:
 - 7.1 The winner of the Prentice Cup will not be eligible to win the U16 Championship Trophy.
 - 7.2 Those players who are not-affiliated to WGSA (i.e. non-SA players) are not eligible to win nett prizes.
- 8. <u>Caddies:</u> Competitors may not engage a person who is or has been a member of a professional golf association as a caddie. Persons who have regained their amateur status are not included in this prohibition. <u>Caddies may be reserved by contacting Rondebosch Golf Club (Tel: 021 6894176).</u> The Rondebosch Golf Club Caddie Policy must be adhered to.
 - <u>Penalty for breach of condition</u>: Stroke play Two strokes for each hole at which any breach occurred; maximum penalty per round Four strokes. (two strokes at each of the first two holes at which any breach occurred). If a breach is discovered between the play of two holes, it is deemed to have been discovered during play of the next hole, and the penalty must be applied accordingly.
 - A player having a caddie in breach of this condition must immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred ensure that she conforms with this condition for the remainder of the stipulated round. Otherwise, the player is disgualified. For stableford divisions: see Note 1 to Rule 32-1b in the Rules of Golf.
 - **Guest Caddies:** Parents/friends must pay a Guest Caddie fee of R 30 per round payable at Registration and will be required to wear an official caddie bib during a stipulated round.
- 9. <u>Transport</u>: Players must not ride on any form of transportation during a stipulated round (unless authorized to ride by a Rules Official or a member of the Tournament Committee).
 - <u>Penalty for Breach of Condition</u>: Stroke play Two strokes for each hole at which any breach occurred; maximum penalty per round Four strokes (two strokes at each of the first two holes at which any breach occurred). If a breach is discovered between the play of two holes, it is deemed to have been discovered during play of the next hole, and the penalty must be applied accordingly. The use of any unauthorized form of transportation must be discontinued immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred. Otherwise, the player is disqualified. For stableford divisions: see Note 1 to Rule 32-1b in the Rules of Golf.
- 10. Pace of Play: WP Golf Pace of Play Regulations are in force and displayed on the Tournament Notice Board.
- 11. Players with Disabilities: The Tournament Committee will determine and publish modifications to the rules of golf which will apply to individual disabled players playing in a tournament using the R & A Limited Modifications of the Rules of Golf for Golfers with Disabilities as a guideline. For such modifications to be considered, a player must be a registered affiliated member of the South African Disabled Golf Association (SADGA) or a governing body recognized by SADGA. For such players, consideration may also be given to the modification of the Transport Condition of Competition (See 10 above). Applicants must apply individually to have their case considered by the Tournament Committee.
- 12. <u>Score Information</u>: If requested to do so players must provide score information to Tournament Officials during the course of play.
- 13. <u>Scoring & Results</u>: A competitor is considered to have returned her score card when she has left the designated scoring area. The results are deemed to be officially announced and the competition closed at the commencement of the prize giving ceremony.
- 14. <u>Dress Code</u>: Host Club dress code in the Club House and WP Golf code on the course.

- 15. <u>Drug Free Sport</u>: A competitor shall not make use of any drug to enhance her performance. The attention of competitors is drawn to the prescribed list of drugs issued by the South African Institute for Drug Free Sport. Consult their website www.drugfreesport.org.za or telephone 0861 272437 during office hours. Any Competitor infringing this condition or refusing to take a test if asked to do so, may be disqualified.
- 16. <u>Publicity</u>: WP Golf and the sponsors of the Championship may arrange publicity before, during and after the Tournament in the press, by live and recorded radio, television and by filming. The competitors assent to references to them and pictures of them at practice and in play appearing and being used for commercial purposes by WP Golf and their Sponsors.
- 17. <u>Etiquette</u>: The audible emission or unauthorized use of a mobile telephone or electronic equipment on the golf course or during play is a serious breach of etiquette and will attract a warning and possible disqualification (Rule 33-7).
- 18. Weather Delays and Suspension of Play: The following signals are in force:

Discontinue Play Immediately: One prolonged note of siren.

Discontinue Play: Three consecutive notes of siren, repeated.

Resume Play: Two short notes of siren, repeated.

The Note under Rule 6-8b is applicable - Appendix I Part C 4 in the Rules of Golf applies. In the event of play being delayed or declared null and void for any round of the tournament, additional play will be at the discretion of the Tournament Committee. If in the opinion of the Tournament Committee, adverse weather or any other occurrence beyond its control render the commencement or continuation of any stipulated round impractical, then the result will be declared over the number of rounds completed by all players. Play will not be continued beyond the advertised final day of the event.

- 19. <u>Spectators:</u> Spectators to keep off tees, fairways and greens at all times and not to interfere with any player. The audible emission of cell phones is not acceptable and cell phones should be switched off. The use of motorised golf cars by spectators is not permitted without the consent of the WP Golf Women's President. Failure to adhere to such requests could lead to the spectators being asked to leave the golf course.
- 20. <u>Liability</u>: The Union does not warrant or guarantee the safety of any person. The Union and its management will not be held liable or responsible for any damages, loss, including personal loss and or other forms of loss, harm or injury sustained as stipulated below:-
 - Physical and/or emotional injuries suffered by any person, including a player or spectator, during the tournament, due to any acts of God, suffered as a direct result thereof, including aspects such as being struck by lightning, etc.
 - Physical injuries of any kind suffered by any person, including a player or spectator, sustained by own negligence, or otherwise.
 - Emotional injuries sustained due to any loss, including death, suffered as a result of any of the above injuries sustained personally or by a spectator.
 - Damages suffered to any property of a player or spectator.
- 21. <u>Code of Conduct</u>: Players' attention is drawn to the WGSA Junior Code of Conduct, which is in effect during the tournament. This will be displayed on the Notice Board during events.
